Literacy

In November, we will continue phonics, focusing on the sounds V, W, X, and Y. Children are expanding their vocabulary and honing their sound recognition skills as they progress in their phonics journey.

Numeracy

We've been working on graphs, shapes, patterns, subtraction and addition, and we'll continue to focus on these topics for the rest of the month to ensure a solid understanding.

UOI

This month's Unit of Inquiry centers on the theme "How We Express Ourselves." We'll explore diverse forms of self-expression, including art and symbols, and look forward to discovering new ways to communicate our ideas and emotions throughout the month.

Here are some ways you can support your child's learning journey at home:

- Play "I Spy" with sounds (V, W, X, Y) & read simple books. Say a word, ask "What sound does it start with?". Start reading words in books by sounding out the letter.
- Numeracy: Count everyday (stairs, toys) & find ways to explore addition and subtraction at home.

UOI: Explore ways your family expresses themselves at home. Talk about activities where you use art, music, or symbols to share ideas or emotions. This could include creative projects, favorite songs, or special family routines that reflect how you express yourselves.
