SPORTS DAY 2025

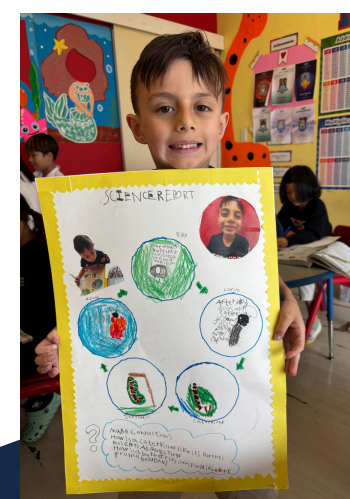
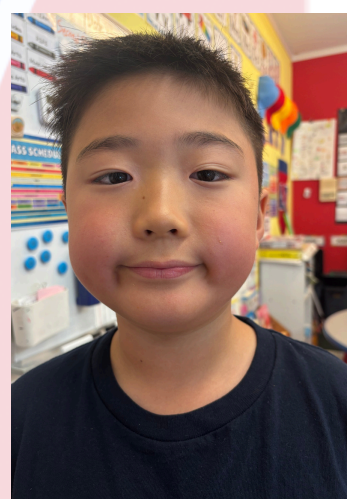

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OUR SCIENCE

A7 students dived into two fascinating science projects. The Butterfly Life Cycle and the Rain Cycle.

Through hands-on activities and creative presentations, students learned how butterflies transform from eggs to caterpillars, then to beautiful butterflies. They also explored the journey of water through evaporation, condensation, and precipitation in the rain cycle.

These projects helped deepen their understanding of nature's amazing processes and sparked their curiosity about the world around them.



OUR ACADEMICS

A7 students completed their assessments in English and Math. In English, they were tested on reading 80-100 words per minute, speaking, and writing skills, showing great effort in expressing themselves clearly. In Math, the focus was on subtraction with two-digit numbers. The students practiced problem-solving and accuracy, demonstrating steady progress.
