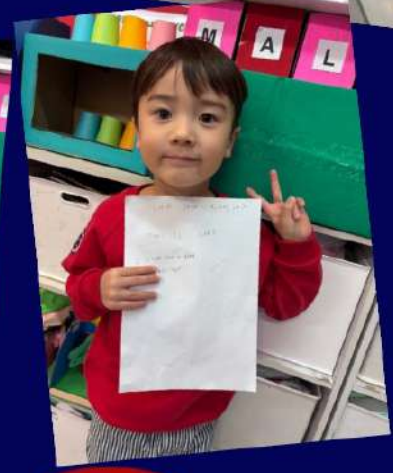

They also learned new sight words and practiced using them in sentences. We connected this lesson to our weather and days-of-the-week theme, creating simple yet meaningful sentences such as "Today is sunny," "Today is Monday," "I can see an apple," and "I can see a banana."

In addition, students learned how to correctly use "a" and "an" in their sentences — a great step toward more confident reading and writing!



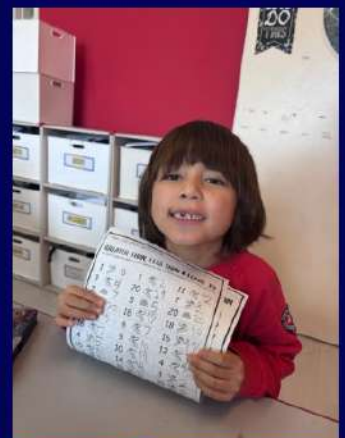
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Mathematics!

In Math, we continued to review greater than, less than, and equal to, but this time, we made it a little more challenging! Students not only identified the symbols but also figured out which number made each comparison correct (for example, $3 < 10 >$). This activity encouraged them to think critically and understand the concept more deeply.



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Physical, Social, and Personal Education (PSPE)!

Our PSPE time was filled with laughter, teamwork, and movement! The students played the paper dance, where they danced to the music and quickly had to fit themselves onto a piece of paper once the music stopped. Each round, the paper got smaller, which made the game even more exciting and silly!

This fun activity helped students practice balance, coordination, and teamwork, as they learned to move carefully, share space, and support one another — all while having so much fun together!
