Phonics Activities

This week in Phonics, the students learned all about the letters /h/ and /z/! about the letters /h/

They practiced identifying each letter, saying the sounds correctly, and finding words that begin with /h/ like hat, hot, hand, and /z/ like zip, zebra, zoo. The students enjoyed tracing the letters, matching pictures to their beginning sounds, and participating in fun sound-recognition games.

Through hands-on activities and repetition, the students strengthened their sound awareness and letter recognition skills. It was a productive and enjoyable week of phonics learning!
