We also introduced the letters U and V, and to make learning enjoyable, we teamed up with the B4 class for a fun review activity. Through interactive games and lively songs, the children practiced recognizing letters and their sounds while learning alongside their friends.

In addition to academic work, we have been focusing on building their communication and social skills. The children are practicing simple conversational phrases both in class and during playtime. They are also learning to use polite expressions such as "please," "thank you," and appropriate greetings. It is wonderful to see them applying these phrases naturally throughout the day, showing growth not only in their language skills but also in kindness and respect toward others.







### **Number and Counting Practice**

Over the past two weeks, our young mathematicians have been exploring the number 11 while also reviewing numbers 8, 9, and 10. They have been practicing how to trace and form each digit, helping them build confidence, recognition, and fine motor control. Through a variety of hands-on activities, the children eagerly identify numbers by sight and enjoy answering questions such as, "What number is this?"

We are also placing special focus on strengthening their counting skills and improving their ability to write numbers correctly. By practicing counting, tracing, and understanding number figures, the students are steadily developing a stronger foundation in early numeracy.





















To make learning even more engaging, we incorporated lively and catchy songs such as "I Like to Draw" by Super Simple, "Dance with Shapes" by Singing Walrus, and "I'm a Shape" from Sing and Learn. With music, movement, and plenty of giggles, the children remained actively engaged and energized, eagerly discovering new shapes while having a wonderful time in the classroom.

# **Arts and Crafts**

Over the past two weeks, our little artists have been buzzing with creativity! They explored the letters U for Umbrella and V for Volcano through fun and engaging crafts. One highlight was creating Thanksgiving baskets, also called cornucopias, where the children selected fruits and vegetables and used them for stamping, as well as cutting and pasting paper to make colorful, textured masterpieces.

These hands-on activities not only reinforced letter recognition but also helped strengthen fine motor skills, foster creativity, and build confidence. The classroom was full of laughter, smiles, and proud "Look what I made!" moments, making each day a joyful celebration of learning and artistic expression.
